On Saturday, July 29th over 190 swimmers participated in the 2023 St. Vincent's Swim Across the Sound. The 36th Annual Swim consisted of 8 Solo swimmers, 1 two-person relays, 18 Classic (non-wetsuit) relays, 12 Traditional (wetsuit) relays and 2 Corporate Challenge relays. Half of the 34 team relays were first year teams.

The 2023 Swim can be characterized as one of resiliency and trust. With the reality of cutting teams due to boat breakdowns, family emergencies and forecasted weather, <u>we all</u> came together to make this year a huge success!

Swim day started off with a bang as thunder, lightning, and torrential rain welcomed the swimmers and volunteers as they arrived at Captain's Cove at 5am to board the buses to take them to the ferry. By the time the buses came out of the darkness and arrived at the Bridgeport ferry, it was sunshine and calm seas as we traveled to Port Jefferson. The Swim Committee still faced a forecast of fastmoving, very powerful storms in the afternoon. The question became when the storms would come, not if.

The Swim commenced at 8:21 am with the Solo swimmers, Two-Person Team and 4 Team Relays. Due to the predicted weather, starting wave times were condensed from 45 minutes to 30 minutes to enable the entire field swimming as soon as possible - Wave 2 started at 8:46 am and Wave 3 at 9:21am. The conditions seemed almost perfect with the exception of the high water temperature. The Long Island Sound is typically 70-72F in late July, during the Swim reports were water temperatures was high 70's to low 80's.

The Swim Committee acutely followed our weather service and monitored radar of forecasted severe thunderstorms traveling well north of Long Island Sound throughout day. At 5:55 pm, radar picked up the directional change of a very strong and fast moving line of thunderstorms and lightening. The Swim was immediately called with the remaining Solo swimmer and Teams removed from the water. All boats and swimmers were safely onshore when the intense thunderstorm with high winds ripped through Captain's Cove at approximately 7:30 pm.

The first swimmer to cross the finish line was <u>Solo</u> *Joey Nizzardo* (Monroe, CT) with a time of 7:09. This was Joey's first solo marathon swim and 2nd Swim Across the Sound. Joey and *Nikko Price* (Branford, CT), 2nd finisher and 2022 champion, were within a few boat lengths of each other throughout the Swim until Joey overtook Nikko with less than three miles to go. Nikko finished in at time of 7:15. *William Boldt* (San Antonio, TX) was the 3rd <u>Solo</u> swimmer with a time of 8:29. *Chris Spearing* (Fairfield, CT) was the 4th <u>Solo</u> swimmer with a time of 9:12. *Marcella MacDonald, DPM* was our first female <u>Solo</u> in a time of 9:33; *Arleen Gonzalez* was our 2nd female <u>Solo</u> swimmer was removed due to lightening in the area after 9:46. *Benjamin Casey*, who leaves in two weeks to attempt the English Channel after being weathered-out in June, swam for 5 hours and 45 minutes.

The <u>Two-Person Relay</u> category (non-wetsuit) was won by **The Salty Sirens** in a time of 7:55. This team made up of Amy Meskill and Maribeth Robertson. Maribeth also leaves in two weeks for her English Channel attempt, with Amy joining Maribeth in Dover as her crew. What a team!

In the Team Relay categories, just twenty minutes separated the first and fourth place finish in the <u>Classic</u> (non-wetsuit) category: *Water Rats Swimming* was the fastest finisher overall and finished first in the <u>Classic</u> category (7:23). Marist Men's Swimming (6:25) finished in 2nd place, just two minutes behind the leaders. **The Pool Boys** touched out **Fair Diego** in a photo finish (6:43) for 3rd place. *Lehigh* finished 5th (6:58), followed by 6th *All Gas No Breaks* (7:18), 7th *Team RBG* (7:28), 8th *Split Decision* (7:31), 9th *Pisces Pride* (7:33), 10th *UConn Club Swim* (7:48), 11th *Pisces Strong*, 12th *Swim Club UConn*, 13th *UConn Swim Club* (8:04), 14th *Backus for a Cure* (8:05), 15th *The Sound of Water* (8:10), 16th *The Goofy Goobers* (8:32), 17th *Three Men and a Baby* and 18th *Barbara's Bunch*.

In the <u>Traditional</u> category (wetsuits allowed *The Golden Board Shorts* was 1th in the category in a time of 6:49. *Ironfish* (7:04) finished in 2nd place, followed by *Boo's Crew 3 - Rapids* (7:08) who touched out 4th *Washed Out* (7:08) for 3rd place. Special thank you shout out to 5th place *HOCC Sharks/Black Bearies* (8:30) who agreed to combine forces so another team could swim. *Boo's Crew 2 – Rapids* (8:33) finished 6th, followed by 7th *ST Elevations - Hartford Hospital*, 8th *The MK Fan Club* and 9th *Sound Stormers. Survivors and Boo's Crew 4 - Rapids* fought hard to make the milestones but were eventually moved up.

The <u>Corporate Challenge</u> category was won by first-year team **Wallingford Energy** (9:01). St. Vincent's Emergency Department team, **Code Blue Fish** (9:03) was 2nd and cannot wait for a rematch next year.

The "**Dream of Life**" award was presented by his brother and Committee member, Jeff Sargent, to *Greg Sargent* for his commitment and dedication to the Swim Across the Sound. Greg gave a heart-felt speech about impact the Swim has had on him and his family. Greg has participated in the Swim since nearly the beginning. Greg and the Fair Diego teams has fundraised over \$800,000 alone and inspired so many swimmers to participate in the Swim and helped thousands of patients going through cancer through fundraising.

While the Swim provides a venue for swimmers to get in shape, meet new people and create some friendly competition, the success of the Swim Across the Sound is measured by the amount of donations we raise and the number of patients and their families we can help. The 2023 Swim Across the Sound was a huge success, raising over \$455,000 as of Swim Day with more funds coming in each day.

• FIVE teams raised over \$20,000! *Boo's Crew 23* (\$29.3k), *Survivors* (\$27.2k) at the top of the leader board, *Boo's Crew 4- Rapids* (\$22.8k), *Fair Diego* (\$21k) and *Code Blue Fish* (\$20.3k)

- THIRTEEN teams raised over \$10,000! Adding ST Elevations - Hartford Hospital, Sound Stormers, Wallingford Energy, The Pool Boys, Backus for a Cure, Split Decision, All Gas No Breaks, Washed Up
- SIX first-year teams raised over \$10,000!
